

The Climate Challenge in Conwy

July 2024



Conwy County Borough Council now has 15 electric vehicles in our fleet, this includes:

- 5 pool cars
- 3 small vans
- 2 road sweepers
- 5 recycling collection vehicles

These vehicles have replaced old diesel and petrol vehicles and will help the Council to reduce the emissions from our fleet.

We have written staff travel guidance for our staff to help them choose carbon friendly travel choices such as walking and cycling when they are commuting or travelling for business.



We have created a Net Zero Carbon Emissions e-learning module for Conwy County Borough Council staff to improve their understanding of climate change and reducing carbon emissions.

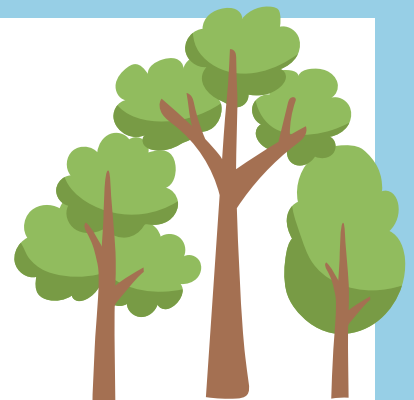


Conwy County Borough Council has secured grant funding from Welsh Government which we will use to:

- Buy electric vehicles
- Install solar panels at some schools
- Put a new heating system in a rural school
- Fit electric vehicle chargers in some public car parks

We have made a tree nursery at our existing plant nursery to grow locally harvested trees. The types of trees we have chosen to grow are the best at absorbing carbon. Once mature enough they will be planted in the County to absorb some of the carbon that is made from our activities.

Since we declared a climate emergency in 2019 an additional **2073 trees** have been planted in Conwy County.
